Discussion Questions

- There are two scenes back-to-back in the Casino Royale hotel that show a difference between how Le Chiffre and Bond both treat women in danger. What does this juxtaposition say about both men?
- Do you think there are jobs in the real world that require people to, as Vesper says, "switch off" morality? What are they?
- Would you be able to put aside morality for a job? What do you think that does to a person?
- Who do you think is clearly "good" and "bad" in this film?
- Do you think bad deeds can be good if they are done for the overall good?
